### *Lower Columbia College*

**Working** and going to school? Transfer to Linfield College and finish a bachelor's degree. Linfield will accept 108 quarter credits of community college coursework with grades of C or better. This equals 72 semester credits of the 125 cumulative semester credits that you need to graduate from Linfield College.

**Majors** in Accounting, Management, Nursing (for RN's) and Social and Behavioral Sciences can be completed online. Additional majors are Arts & Humanities, Business Information Systems and International Business. Almost all requirements for these majors can be completed online. Face-to-face evening and weekend classes are held on the Linfield campuses in Portland and McMinnville and occasionally in other locations.

If you want to find out how your credits transfer toward a Linfield bachelor's degree, email or fax a copy of your unofficial transcript to the Adult Degree Program. Be sure to include your name and address and the major you are considering.

\* Courses used to fulfill Linfield Curriculum requirements must be at least 3 quarter credit hours.

\*\* Students must demonstrate math proficiency through one of the following means: score 520 or higher on the mathematics portion of the SAT; complete a college math course at or above the level of intermediate algebra with a grade of C or better (a C- does not count), or pass the Math Proficiency test which will be offered during the fall and spring. Math proficiency must be demonstrated (1) by the end of a student's first year at Linfield or (2) by the end of a student's sophomore year.
