Grades and Transcripts

Grades will be available in WebAdvisor within two weeks after the end of the semester. We do not mail grades. If you experience difficulty in logging on to your WebAdvisor account, please call DCE at 800-452-4176. We will be happy to send unofficial transcripts upon request. Requests for unofficial transcripts must be signed and may be mailed or faxed to our offices. Official transcripts must be requested in writing and cost \$5 for the first transcript and \$1 for each additional transcript per order. Include the complete address of where you want the transcript sent, your student ID number, approximate dates of attendance, and your signature, or select the "Transcript" link from the DCE site, http://www.linfield.edu/registrar/RegSchedule.php#_transcripts

Admission to the Adult Degree Program

From anywhere in the USA call toll free 1-800-452-4176, and we will connect you with an advisor who is knowledgeable about the degree or certificate program you are considering.

Prior college coursework is not required for admission. Most college credits with grades of C and higher from regionally accredited colleges, will apply toward a Linfield degree.

Financial Aid

Financial Aid is available to all eligible degree or certificate-seeking students enrolled for the appropriate number of credits. Various grants and subsidized Stafford Loans are available to those students who demonstrate financial need, and unsubsidized Stafford Loans are awarded to students on a no-need basis. Students must be admitted to the College prior to receiving a financial aid award. In order to be eligible for financial aid the student must be enrolled in at least 6 credits and complete the proper paperwork:

- Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) Title IV code: 003198
- Linfield Application for Financial Aid (LAFA)
- A year-long academic plan submitted by your advisor.

Veteran's Benefits

Majors

In the Bachelor's degree, there are seven majors and one minor available through Linfield's Adult Degree Program.

Majors: Accounting*, Arts & Humanities, Business Information Systems, International Business, Management*, Social & Behavioral Sciences*, and Nursing* (RN - BSN only)

Minor: Environmental Studies

Certificates

Students may earn Certificates in Computer Information Systems, Human Resource Management*, Marketing* and Accounting*. The Accounting Certificate is post-baccalaureate only.

Credit for Prior Learning

Many adults return to college with learning acquired from a variety of sources (on the job, non-credit workshops, travel, personal interests, homemaking, and volunteer responsibilities). As many as 31 semester credits may be earned by developing a portfolio in which this learning is shown to be equivalent to specific college courses. The portfolio class, IDST 250, is offered online each fall semester. In addition, college credit can be awarded for the successful completion of challenge exams, CLEP (College-Level Examination Program), and many employer-sponsored courses evaluated by the American Council on Education (ACE).
