### ONLINE (BLACKBOARD CE) INSTRUCTIONS

Once you have enrolled in an online class, an online demonstration class will be accessible starting Wednesday, June 10 after 5PM. Open your browser and go to <http://www.linfield.edu/dce>. Under "Current Students" select the "Go to Blackboard CE" link. This will take you to a login screen. Your username will be your Linfield CatNet account (Webmail and WebAdvisor) username. If you haven't already signed up for a Linfield CatNet account go back to the "Current Students" link and select "Computer Accounts." On the Computer Accounts page, follow the directions for opening a CatNet account. Your password for an online class is the same as CatNet and Webmail. The class(es) you have registered for will start Monday, June 15. Make sure you can log in before this date. When you log in on Wednesday the 10th, you will see your list of available classes.
