ANT 326 Archaeological Field Methods

Join an archaeological team from Portland State University's Laboratory of Archaeology and Linfield's Museum of Anthropology in research June 15 through July 10 at sites near McMinnville, Oregon. This intensive, four-week, 5-credit class will focus on the methods of finding and documenting precontact and historic archaeological sites in an area half an hour from campus: Parrett Mountain, where we have located 'China Camp', a turn-of-the-century laborers' village. This is pure archaeological exploration!

Housing will be available on the Linfield campus.

Students will learn: use of GPS in field survey * documenting archaeological sites * documenting artifacts * site survey techniques * screening techniques * augering techniques * shovel-testing techniques * soil classification and description * artifact and site illustration and sketch-mapping * field analysis of common artifact types * report-writing skills. \$800 est. trip fee includes travel, lodging and meals.

ENV 302 AM Shoreline Ecology

Dr. Ned Knight will introduce you to different types of coastal environments and to some of the organisms found in each. One weekend on campus June 27-28 plus 5 days in Newport, July 22 through July 26. \$60 trip fee. Lodging and food are not provided. 3 credits. *NW*

ENV 300 Fire History of the Cascades

Dr. Peter Schoonmaker. Study the science and politics guiding national fire policy using as a case study the 92,000 acre B&B Complex Fire that burned in the Deschutes and Willamette National Forests in the summer of 2003. Class time will be spent in field work and consultation with USFS staff. Accommodation will be at Monkey Face Ranch, overlooking the Crooked River and Smith Rock State Park. Students must be prepared for long strenuous days. June 16 through 21. Space is limited so register early. \$70 trip fee includes lodging and transportation. 3 credits.

HHP 088 Backpacking

Backpack in the Oregon Cascades August 23-25. One Saturday on campus 8/8. \$25 trip fee includes travel, food and permits.
