



## Bus

Need to go to Hillsboro, Tigard, or Salem? The Yamhill County Transit Area (YCTA) has multiple bus routes students can use to get around.

Catch a ride for only \$1.25 one-way fare, or even \$2.50 for a day pass! For more info about the bus schedule, visit

Some available routes are:

- **North to Hillsboro** (Route 33)
- **South to West Salem** (Route 11)
- **West to West Valley** (Route 22) or Grand Ronde [Route 24s (Sat.)]
- **East to Tigard** [Routes 44 (weekdays); 46s (Sat.); 45x (am weekdays)]

Need to go outside Yamhill County? From the Tigard Transit Center, commuters may take the city bus all over the Portland-Metro area. Visit [trimet.org](http://trimet.org) to help plan your trip.

## Train

There is not an Amtrak train station in McMinnville but there are three stations about an hour from Linfield.




## Linfield Offers

### Linfield Shuttle

The Shuttle Service has a \$20 per student fee for a one-way trip. The fee will be placed on the students' account after the shuttle service has been provided. To reserve a place on one of the following shuttles, fill out the form on the page at: [www.linfield.edu/activities/shuttle.html](http://www.linfield.edu/activities/shuttle.html) Students will receive an email in response confirming their reservation. Shuttles are on a first come, first serve basis. Sign ups will be closed 72 hours before the scheduled time and cancellations must occur 48 hours in advance of the shuttle, or the entire fee will be charged to the student. The shuttles will go to the airport first, and then make a stop at the train station if there is a need.

The **Ride Board** (near the west entrance of Riley) is a place for students to ask for/offer rides to other students. This info must be provided with each post:

- Desired destination
- Date & time of ride
- *Your name*
- Contact info (email or phone number)
- Other info (able to pay for gas, etc.)

The **Bike Co-op** offers free bike services. Students can bring their bike to the Bike Co-op to learn about the ins and outs of bike maintenance and safety. They can obtain free maintenance service and only need to pay for parts. The Bike Co-op initiated a bike loan program that offers the use of bikes to students for no cost. Rentals include lights, a lock, and a helmet.

## U Share Program



Linfield is among the first colleges in the Pacific Northwest to partner with U Car Share, a program that allows members to use a car on an hour-by-hour basis or a day depending on your needs. **Type "LINFIELD" in the promotional code box** to waive initial sign up fees. Costs for car use include gas, insurance, and 24/7 customer service and roadside assistance, and are available near Whitnell Commons and the HP Apartments.
