
Linfield Education Department Alumni Survey Report Spring of 2020

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Of alumni survey participants (n=33) reported that they are employed in the field of Education.




## States Where Linfield Grads Work

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## Please describe one highlight from your experience in the Linfield Education Department

- The literacy courses really opened my ideas to quality reading instruction and also brought about my interest of Curriculum.
- I am so thankful to have experienced a 4-year bachelor's degree program with a robust student teaching requirement. I felt very prepared for the classroom and appreciated the flexibility to pursue graduate work in my content area.

## One piece of advice for current or future education students

- Ask ALL the questions, try to observe as many grade levels as possible, be open to feedback from professors/student teacher supervisors
- Gain exposure to as many different classes and grade levels as possible, focus on ELL instruction
- Visit as many classrooms as possible to gather ideas that work for you and your teaching style.




## One piece of advice for current or future education students (continued)

- Spend as much time as possible in the classroom. Volunteer.
- Network and put yourself out there! You never know what doors will open to opportunities ahead.
- Get your ESOL endorsement! Mine has helped me tremendously working in an urban school setting. The skills I learned in the ESOL courses transferred to teaching multiple grades and levels and truly helps all of my students, regardless of their English proficiency.
- Be dependable. Even though you are a college students, when you are working with kids they always see you as an adult. It's important to act like one and follow through with your commitments.

- It gave me the foundations and passion needed to have longevity in my career.
- My experience at Linfield truly shaped who I am as a person and a teacher today. I value collaborating with my colleagues, observing and letting others observe me, and continuing the learning process!
