- Innovative Curricular Development In addition to January Term course development, I have created and developed a unique course entitled, *Drumwise: Sociological, Historical, Musical, and Wellness Perspectives on Drums, Drummers, and Drumming*. This 200 level course offers both (GP) Global Pluralisms and (CS) Creative Studies credit in the Linfield Curriculum. • Innovative Curricular Development (continued) The Inquiry Seminar that I teach regularly is What to Listen for in the World. I developed the original course and continuously transform it to meet important themes at Linfield University. For example, I have included learning modules to be included in the PLACE THEMES Legacies of War, and The Elements. I further adapted the course to relate to Sustainability and learned about the relatively new field of Ecomusicology, which continues to inspire my research and teaching. In my aligning course content with important overarching themes chosen by Linfield University Faculty, this Inquiry Seminar is never duplicated from semester to semester but remains new and fresh to both students and teacher. Fall 2016 was the first time that INQS What to Listen for in the World was placed in the Blackboard Learning Management System.

• The introductory conducting course I teach includes observations of the finest conductors, including Carlos Kalmar with the Oregon Symphony Orchestra. I began to offer students the opportunity to conduct the Linfield Concert Band on one piece in the spring concert. I also have begun to have the conducting students prepare an entire concert for the spring Arts in the Quad Band Concert which features the student conductors who plan, prepare, and produce the event. The experiential learning component of conducting involves an immense time commitment and is quite beneficial for students. I have also led advanced conducting and conducting internship courses for those students wishing to further pursue the art of conducting.
