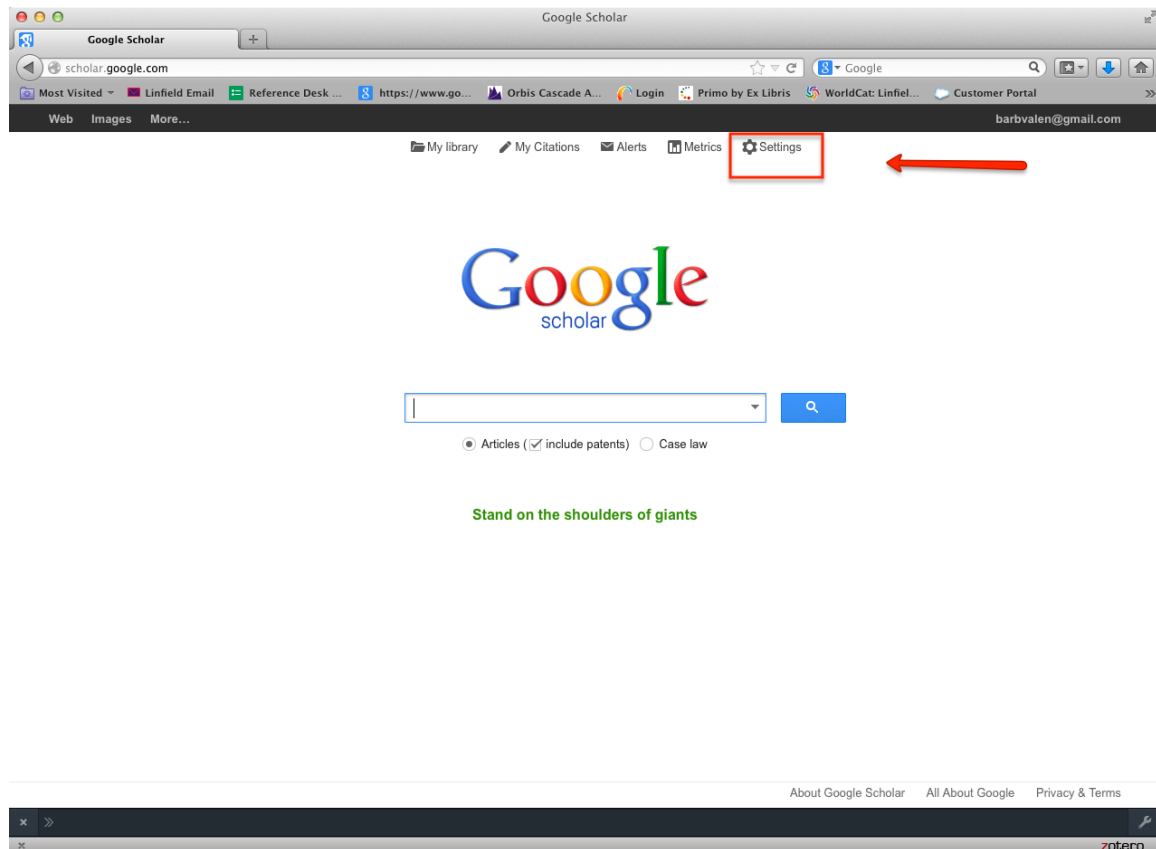


How do I link the Linfield Library to Google Scholar?

If you link Linfield College Libraries to [Google Scholar](https://scholar.google.com), you can search Google Scholar and see links to full text items that we have in the library. Otherwise much content discovered through Google Scholar will require you to pay to see the full text.

Follow these steps to link Google Scholar to the Linfield College Libraries collection:

1. Go to [Google Scholar](https://scholar.google.com) (<http://scholar.google.com>).
2. Click **Settings** in the upper right.



3. Click **Library Links** on the left.


