Wildcat Welcome Weekend activities are **required** for all new students unless otherwise specified.

THURSDAY, AUGUST 21

9am – 12pm: Jump Start Zone – Need to complete some steps? Have any questions? Follow up with the offices on the lawn outside of Taylor Hall to make plans to complete the process to be move-in ready! *Linfield Avenue to Blaine Street.*

9am – 12pm: Student Check-In and Move-In – Check-in will include picking up your welcome packet, residence hall and mail keys, and student ID. Students will be sent their specific arrival time by the housing team via email before their check-in date. *Linfield Avenue to Blaine Street.*

- **Spanish:** Students with more than one year prior Spanish experience **must** take a placement test to ensure correct course level. Contact Dr. Sandra Terra (sterra@linfield.edu) for additional information. *Walker Hall 311.*

ROGs, ROLs, & FIRST SEMESTER SEMINAR

Every student is part of a **Registration & Orientation Group (ROG)** with other new students. You will meet with your ROG throughout Wildcat Welcome Weekend, and on Monday nights this fall to complete First Semester Seminar Lab (IDST 007L / IDST 009L).

First Semester Seminar is comprised of two parts: meetings with a faculty advisor throughout the semester (IDST 007, or IDST 009 for transfer students); and a Monday night lab with peers in your ROG that is facilitated by your ROL (IDST 007L or IDST 009L).

GROUP & INDIVIDUAL ADVISING

Incoming students are paired with a peer advisor (Registration & Orientation Leader) and a faculty advisor (IDST 007L/009L). First generation students will have an additional peer and faculty mentor. Advising meetings help build the advisor-advisee relationship and cover important topics related to academic success at Linfield.

LINFIELD DINING OPTIONS

- ★ **Dillin Dining Hall**- Offering multiple meals a day with allergen friendly and vegan/vegetarian options, students on a meal plan will find delicious and well-balanced meals. With one meal

swipe students have an “all you care to eat” buffet-style dining experience. Ask about the Reusable To-Go Container Program!

- ★ **Wildcat Express-** Students can use a Meal Equivalency/meal swipe at Wildcat Express to choose a prepacked meal equivalency – one main item (salad, wrap or sandwich), two side items (fruit, chips, or cookie) and beverage (bottled water or soda) and take it with them to enjoy now or later.
- ★ **Dillin after Dark** – Opening when Dillin closes after dinner. Ordering and payment with flex dollars or a credit/debit card is handled exclusively via the Everyday app. Orders are picked up from the exterior walk-up take-out window located on the east side of Dillin Hall.
- ★ **24/7 Mack's MarCat** – The small convenience store at Dillin Hall is accessible 24/7 and offers hundreds of fresh food and snack items that students can purchase using flex dollars or a credit/debit card without leaving campus.
- ★ **24/7 just baked Smart Bistro** - Nestled on the 1st floor of Riley Hall behind Starbucks, students may use flex dollars or a credit/debit card to purchase hot food items, snacks and desserts served up from the just baked Smart Bistro around-the-clock.
- ★ **Starbucks-** Located in Riley Hall students are welcome to refuel with Starbucks coffee, drinks, and food that students can buy with flex cash. Great place to meet with staff, peers, or get some studying done. You can also find a Starbucks self-serve vending machine in the Nicholson Library! Purchase with flex dollars or a credit/debit card. Great place to meet with staff, peers, or get some studying done.
